Since space is limited, I will simply thank you

for your exuberance in taking on the RUF (Really Ugly Fabric)

challenge and I hope you also will join the PIGS (Projects In Grocery Sacks) challenge.

For those of you who were too late to get a swatch of the RUF, perhaps you can find a friend who did; ask if they would share some of it with you or whether you can collaborate with them on a block. To help you all join the fun, here are the guidelines for the two challenges.

#### President's RUF Challenge 2010-11. The following rules apply:

- One RUF fabric (distributed at the September meeting) must be used in your block. 1.
- You may add one white value fabric as background, and up to two additional coordinating or complimentary fabrics 2. may be added to complete your block. All your additional fabrics should be 100% cotton.
- Your block must measure 12 ½" x 12 ½" unfinished. This includes a ¼" seam allowance that will be used to finish the 3. block.
- Cotton embroidery floss can be used for embellishment. No fabric paints or photo transfers please. 4.
- Completed blocks must be returned to Lita Romanick by April 2, 2011, for inclusion in the quilt. 5.
- 6. All blocks submitted become the property of the North Star Quilters Guild to be incorporated into a quilt for a charitable organization of the President's choice; this year that will be the Pregnancy Crisis Center. The plan is to show the quilt at the October 2011 show and then deliver it after that show for use by the Pregnancy Crisis Center at its discretion.

#### President's PIGS Challenge 2010-11. The following rules apply:

- Bring to the October 2, 2010, meeting one of your UFOs that you have put off completing for more than a year. 1.
- At show and tell, show your UFO. This means you are committing yourself to finish it no later than the August 6, 2. 2011, meeting.
- 3. On or before the August 6, 2011 meeting, bring your completed PIGS challenge project for show and tell.

Everyone who takes this challenge should have a quilt to display at the 2011 quilt show! Since "sewing mends the soul" (author unknown), I wish for you each a month of quilting through any challenges you may face!

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Suzanne Gandrud reported a fiscal year ending balance of \$5,085.33 in the general fund and a balance of \$16,633.87 in the Long Range Educational Planning fund. Balances through September 11, 2010, are \$5,051.33 in general fund and \$17,087.46 in Long Range Education Planning fund. It was moved by Kim Jones and seconded by Pam Peterson to accept report. Motion carried.

Quilts & Coffee – Janet Gregory. Report was published in newsletter summing up last year's events. The first event of this year with Pat Knoechel provided a profit of \$530 and had 150 in attendance, drawing from a large area. Members are encouraged to provide suggestions for local speakers for future Quilts & Coffee.

Moved to approve expenditure for Yvonne Hollenbeck by Diana Randall, seconded by Pam Peterson. Motion carried.

Christmas Party – Mary Urbanski volunteered to put together a committee to plan the party.

Finance Committee will report next month.

Long Range Planning Committee – Kim Jones will take over as chair of that committee.

#### A STEP BACK IN TIME

Originally printed in Quilter's Newsletter Magazine Special 15th Anniversary Issue, 1984; reprinted in Common Threads Quilters Guild newsletter, March 1, 2010

1969: Man took his first steps on the moon. There were no "quilt shops." Instead quilt makers sought out precious cottons in fabric stores filled with synthetics, polyesters, acrylics, rayon, and the ubiquitous double knits. A few stores had patchwork fabric (made from machine stitched 5" squares) for \$5.50/yard. Some clothing patterns utilizing this fabric were available. The master quilt makers from the first half of the 20th century were gone and a new generation of quilt makers was beginning to experiment and find its way-Chris Wolf Edmonds, Jean Ray Laury, and Patricia Cox. Cooperatives in West Virginia and Alabama were earning money for their financially deprived areas by supplying quilts to big stores in New York City. Some clubs were forming and met in church basements or local community buildings to work on one another's quilts or did quilting for hire to raise money for their churches or other special causes. They brought a covered dish for lunch so they could quilt all day. They were not involved in anything but making quilts and enjoying each other's company. Margaret Icke's The Standard Book of Quilt Making and Collecting had been published in 1949 and was still the major how-to book available. In September 1969, the first issue of Quilter's Newsletter came off the press. The first issue of what would come to be known as "The Magazine for Quilt Lovers" was just 16 pages long and cost \$.35. Like the quilting boom that was just beginning, the magazine was to grow and expand to meet the needs of a modern generation of quilt makers.

#### **Treasurer's Report**

Nancy Zimney reported a balance of \$5,179.02 in the general fund and a balance of \$17,237.46 in the Long Range Educational Planning fund. Moved by Kim Jones, seconded by Toni Poochigian to pay two outstanding bills requiring board approval to Action Graphics for \$368.72 and Copy Cat Printing for \$239.12. Motion carried.

#### **Old Business**

Bonnie Solberg and Connie Selle will be auditing the NSQG books September 29<sup>th</sup> to be complete for October meeting.

Educational Conference report by Lita Romanick through email from Kathy Detke: Judy Neimeyer is flying into GF, not Fargo, on Friday. Colleen Carlson has been notified, and we are still trying to figure out how to get the flight itinerary. All four presenters for the conference agreed to have a flyer at their vending booths this weekend at the Fargo quilt show. The registration form has been modified and the four presenter's class description and pictures have been put on one page for this flyer. A copy was sent to Connie. She will make copies and deliver to the booths on Friday. Colleen Carlson will be getting the contract to have the trunk show quilts sent to her house from Judy's manager. More registrations are still needed to break even; currently we will have a deficit of approximately \$800 based on estimated publicity costs.

Raffle Quilt: Connie Selle is still collecting money from ticket sales. Ticket sales are down, but that is attributed to sales of 6 months while we previously sold tickets for a year and low sales at Heritage Days, which was previously a good spot to sell.

International Day: There is a need for a new chair as Elaine has resigned her position. A letter will be going out to the Winnipeg group this week concerning our policy on charging participants.

#### **New Business**

The Quilt Show contract for speaker, Yvonne Hollenbeck, arrived, and will be reviewed by Lita Romanick.

Motion made by Bonnie Solberg, seconded by Joyce Muz to approve the following policy for the loan of the new design wall donated in memory of Anna Avolio:

It was moved by Kim Jones, seconded by Joyce Muz to approve the budget after correction of a duplicate \$50 to EGF Senior Center, removing this expense from Gifts/Donations. Motion carried.

After a discussion of the presented proposed budgets from the Long Range Education committee, it was moved by Kim Jones, seconded by Toni Poochigian, to request a proposed operating budget only for the Guild and Quilts & Coffee for this current fiscal year. Motion carried.

It was moved by Toni Poochigian, seconded by Joyce Muz, to approve the proposed Quilts & Coffee budget for 2010-2011. Motion carried.

Board proposed returning the Education Conference budget to the LREP committee to be adjusted to represent actual expenses after the conclusion of the conference. This will be presented to board at the October meeting. The Quilt Show budget will be adjusted to estimate expenses to represent recent changes in format and will be submitted by late 2010. Long Range Education Planning: Kim Jones reported on the need for committee members, including a Monthly Education chair, a Facilities chair, Publicity chair, and International Day chair.

*Newsletter* Report (Bev Solseng): Deadline for October newsletter is September 25<sup>th</sup>.

*Member at Large* (Bonnie Solberg): A fabric exchange was suggested for the Christmas party.

*Raffle Quilt* (Connie Selle): Connie sent report that she will chair again, if quilt is made available. There are several quilts available to be considered for this.

*Show and Tell*: Kim Jones and Toni Poochigian will work together for this month. Elaine Hoffarth is resigning this chair so it is open to a member who would like to take this on.



She made a quilt for her great grandson Mathias' 1st grade at Waldorf School, San Francisco, CA. Beth Lever helped her put it together and finish it. It sold for \$5,750!

Not only has she published her writing, but her quilts have also been published. In her photo you can see her piano quilt which was published in Quilters Newsletter Magazine, and it is scheduled to "reappear" in American Quilts. After all those accomplishments, note that Wynona's quilting ambition is to "sew in a straight line by machine!"
